The Village of Benton Regular Board Meeting was called to order by Village President, Gary McCrea at 6:30 p.m. in the conference room of the Benton Business Incubator Building at 244 Ridge Avenue on Wednesday, August 21st, 2013, with the following members present: Gary McCrea, Rose Walton, Jessica Polfer, Jim Sysko, Terry Sheffer, and Cal Robbins. Chuck Wartner arrived at 6:35 p.m. Absent: none. Citizens present: Jim and Eldon Kruser. Employees: Elizabeth Schoenmann and Ryan Carver. Others present: Consultants from Town & Country Engineering, Gene Laschinger and Ben Heidemann, and Officer Chris Donar. Proper notice of the meeting had been posted in four public places; the Village of Benton Business Incubator Building, Benton State Bank, Benton Post Office, and the Zephyr Depot, in compliance with the Open Meeting Law.

Motion (Walton, Sysko) to accept the meeting minutes of the regular village board meeting held July 17th, and the street lighting committee meeting held August 7th as presented. Voice-all ayes. Carried.

Gene Laschinger and Ben Heidemann of Town & Country Engineering presented information regarding the reduction of phosphorus levels in the Fever River. Options included a treatment upgrade, using an adaptive management plan or water quality trading plan, or receiving a variance. The compliance schedule for reducing phosphorus levels would vary from 5-15 years depending on the method used.

The July 2013 police report was approved as distributed by general consent.

Jim and Eldon Kruser presented an updated design for the planned Veteran's Memorial in the Village Park. The new design adjusts the sidewalk location to the side of the memorial. This allows the existing monument to remain in its current location while addressing the issue of snow removal for the sidewalk. A tree in the park will need to be removed to accommodate this. Fund raising efforts are still underway with a bulk mailing just being completed. Information for 682 veterans has been collected thus far with more to be expected.

Ryan Carver distributed information for replacing the sand in the Village and Swift Park. A type of sand wasp has invaded the sand and will return each year unless the sand is removed. Carver presented two options, rubber mulch and wood mulch. Pea gravel was also discussed, but it gets quite hot and is dangerous when the grass is mowed. Rubber mulch has a higher initial cost than wood mulch; however, it does not decay or rot, requires less material depth, and does not require annual mulching, which may make it more cost effective over time.

A park committee meeting will be scheduled to discuss the park trees, equipment, and sand replacement.

Carver also updated the board on the progress of the Swift Park parking lot and the 3rd Ave/3rd Street project. The Swift Park parking lot is completed. The excavation and rock was \$5,167 below the estimate so it was determined the lot will be fog sealed for approximately \$600. 3rd Ave/3rd Street will be blacktopped after Labor Day to avoid being torn up by trucks due to the increased traffic.

Cell phone reimbursement was tabled.

A discussion took place regarding various issues that need to be addressed including the updating of the village website, park bathrooms being vandalized, and trimming of vine and trees on Jenkynsville Road and Bean Street. The website and vine/trees will be looked into. The bathrooms are checked by village employees during weekend pump checks, but no solution was determined for cases when bathrooms are messed up after this is done.

Committee reports were presented. Gary McCrea, police committee chair, distributed a letter from the Lafayette County Sheriff's Department, whom the village has contracted policing with for almost a decade. A cost analysis determined that the current rate paid by the village to the sheriff's department does not cover the cost they incur. The sheriff's department requested an increase of the flat hourly rate to \$38 in 2014. This is based on the hourly wage, holiday and vacation time, FICA, retirement, workmen's comp., life and health insurance paid for by the sheriff's department along with training costs and

supplies. A review by McCrea determined this would still be more cost efficient than re-establishing our own police department. *Motion (Sheffer, Robbins) to continue contracting police service with the Lafayette County Sherriff's Department for \$38/hr in 2014.* Roll-all ayes. Carried.

Motion (Sysko, Polfer) to approve the change in the premise description for Class B retail licenses for GG's, McCarthy's, Lawrence's Pub & Eatery, and Joseph F. McCrea Post No. 7896 from 6:00 pm on September 1, 2013 to 12:00 am on September 2, 2013. Roll-all ayes. Carried.

Motion (Walton, Sysko) to approve a picnic license for St. Augustine Church for August 25, 2013 at St. Patrick's Church Hall. Roll-all ayes. Carried.

Motion (Walton, Sheffer) to approve Elizabeth Schoenmann's attendance at the one day MEUW Accounting and Customer Service Seminar on September 10, 2013. Roll-all ayes. Carried.

The claims against the Village were presented for payment. *Motion (Walton, Wartner) to pay the claims against the Village*. Roll-all ayes. Motion carried.

Motion (Sysko, Wartner) to adjourn. Voice-all ayes. Motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 8:18 p.m
